Communicating with Storytelling embeds important Māori cultural values which inform and enrich the communication skills taught in the course.

Ngākau aroha aligns to the skill of active listening through its meaning of 'having the wellbeing of our people, community and planet at the heart of everything we do'.

Manaakitanga supports the care and understanding of the art of traditional storytelling. More literally, it means to show hospitality, kindness, generosity and support for others.

Whanaungatanga emphasises 'relationships, kinship and family connection'. In our context at Waka Kotahi, it refers to the relationships that develop through working together.

Kotahitanga means we achieve greater things when we work together to build trusted relationships, both inside and outside of Waka Kotahi.
